## Vedanta Drops **Merchant Power Project in** Talwandi Sabo

redanta Group has dropped plans to set up the fourth unit of 660 MW in its thermal power project coming up at Talwandi Sabo. The group will now sell its entire 1980 MW (three units of 660 MW) from the project to Punjab and will have no merchant power (power for open market) from the project.
"The power from fourth



unit was targeted to be sold as merchant power but the company has withdrawn the plans to set up the unit sources in Vedanta Group said. The company was given nod to set up fourth unit of 660 MW by the Punjab gov ernment earlier this year.

The first unit of the \$10,000 crore project being structed by Vedanta Group owned company named Talwandi Sabo Power is likely to be commissioned by the

third quarter of 2012. Earlier this year, the Punjab govern-ment had allowed Vedanta Group to add the fourth unit of 660 MW in the project taking up the capacity of the project to 2640 MW. "The construction of the project is going as per schedule and first unit would be commissioned by October or November in 2012," an official of Talwandi Sabo Power Limited said.

In a move to generate additional power in the state, the Punjab government had enhanced the power generation capacity in all the upcoming power projects in the state. Private players including Vedanta Group, GVK Group, Larsen & Toubro and India Bulls are set-

ting up power projects in the state. Apart from IndiaBulls, other three power majors are in construction stage. L& T had achiphotoeved financial closure in September 2010 for 13,20 MW project The project being set up under build, own and operate mode entails an investment of 79,600 crore. The company has tied up with banks to raise ₹7,200 crore and infuse ₹2,400 crore as equity for the 1,320 MW coal based project. The company was sanctioned a third unit of 660MW in the project in the last year.
